In 1892, Lord Frederick Arthur Stanley donated the Dominion Hockey Challenge Cup - later known as the Stanley Cup - to crown the first Canadian hockey champions. Blood donation is vital in medicine and treatment, and it requires many people to volunteer to donate so as to ensure an adequate and consistent supply of blood. Blood is the living force of human bodies. Therefore, enough blood must always be available in blood banks and hospitals as well to cater for the anticipated requirements of blood. Non-availability of sufficient blood is a problem in some regions of the world particularly in developing countries such as Tanzania. This is because few people are ready to donate blood voluntarily. Factors identified to contribute for people being not ready for voluntary blood donation include among others; Lack of knowledge and appropriate information,

Existing myths and misconceptions towards blood and blood donation as well as inadequate blood donation campaigns targeting community members other than secondary students. To intervene the problem of blood shortages in blood banks and hospitals, sustainable strategies should be devised focusing on motivational education, awareness and information dissemination to attract more eligible blood donors to the blood donation pool.

This study looks closely at the history and intentions of lawyers at top 100 law firms in the USA to donate to their law school alma maters and other law schools. The study includes data on the percentage of lawyers who have ever donated to their law school alma mater, as well as a separate data set about contributions to law schools other than the one attended. In addition, the report presents data on the amounts contributed over the past two years and expected over the next two years. In addition, the study pinpoints those area of law school philanthropy that most interests attorneys at major law school, with separate data sets measuring interest in supporting pro bono/legal clinics, student scholarships, endowed chairs and other faculty support, or specific legal centers or institutes. The report also measures how many attorneys have been recently approached by law schools for financial support, giving specific data for approaches by email, social media, text, phone or mail. Data in the reports is based on a sample of 221 attorneys at 84 major US law firms. Data is broken out by gender, work title, age, law school ranking, predominant area of legal practice and other variables. Just a few of this report's many findings are that: ?24.02% of respondents have been contacted by phone by their old law school in the past year to be asked for a donation.?Lawyers specializing in general finance and banking and in mergers/acquisitions and private equity, were the least likely to have donated.?Partners were more than twice as likely as associates to have donated?On average, women contributed more than men.

The act of giving blood is a complex decision that likely is driven by many factors. As individuals move from receptiveness through commitment to habit maintenance, they become less influenced by extrinsic factors and are affected more by intrinsic considerations. Being a blood donor becomes an important aspect of identity. Most donors were recruited by other donors. Their continued involvement as blood donors was primarily linked to altruistic and empathic reasons. Increased self-esteem from being a blood donor was a more important motivation to donors. Lack of self-esteem will be the barriers towards blood donation. Many fears associated with the blood donation process such as needles, sight of blood and contracting acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) inhibit donors from giving blood. Fear to put on weight after donations are the other most common reason we encounter in our setting.
